



### Check one of the following:

Class A \_\_\_\_\_ Motor Home

A Raw Chassis upon which is built a Driver's Compartment and an entire body which provides temporary living quarters. Also includes converted school busses.

Class B \_\_\_\_\_ Motor Home

A completed van-type vehicle which has been altered to provide temporary living quarters.

Class C \_\_\_\_\_ Motor Home

An incomplete vehicle (chassis and driver's compartment) upon which is permanently attached a body designed to provide temporary living quarters.

And is permanently equipped with the following:

- \_\_\_\_\_ a. **Cooking facilities.**
- \_\_\_\_\_ b. Ice box or mechanical refrigerator.
- \_\_\_\_\_ c. Potable water supply including plumbing and a sink with faucet either self-contained or with connections for an external source or both.
- \_\_\_\_\_ d. **Self-contained toilet or a toilet connected to a plumbing system with connection for external water disposal, or both.**
- \_\_\_\_\_ e. **Heating or air conditioning system or both, separate from the vehicle engine or the vehicle engine electrical system.**
- \_\_\_\_\_ f. A one hundred ten-one hundred fifteen volt alternating current electrical system separate from the vehicle engine electrical system either with its own power supply or with a connection for an external source, or both, or a liquefied petroleum system and supply.
- \_\_\_\_\_ g. Permanently installed systems which meet American National Standards Institute and National Fire Protection Association standards in effect on the date of manufacture..
